Can't afford to live in Montgomery County? Is your household's total annual income at least \$20,000 but not more than \$44,000 for a household of one or \$68,000 for a household of five? If so, and if you have not owned residential property in the past five years, you may be eligible to buy through Montgomery County's Moderately Priced Dwelling Unit Program (MPDU). Applications are accepted only twice a year—January and July—and require a lot of documentation. Your AIM team says: Act quickly!
